

A MESSAGE FROM THE CEO

The start of a new school year is a busy time for all of us. At the Health Trust, we have to update all of our records and make sure that the new teachers and their families are enrolled in one of our health plans. We also have to process the claims submitted during the summer months

when many of you had elective surgeries and dental work and scheduled your physical exams. While all of this is going on, the intensity of the political campaigns is increasing and the uncertainty that the November elections could have on health care becomes more acute. You can be assured that we are watching these events very carefully and are looking at any possible impact the upcoming elections could have on your health benefits.

The Health Trust recently notified you of certain changes made to your plan. These changes were brought about by the need to keep up with the upward inflationary spiral in health care costs. We were able to negotiate more favorable rates with CVS Caremark for your prescription drugs, yet your benefits in most cases will remain substantially the same as they were with Medco. We have also negotiated to bring the pharmacies at Von's and Safeway into the Exclusive Network, thereby providing a wider range of choice that will not require the provider choice fee of \$10. Keeping up with the increasing cost of health care and its ever-increasing complexities entails the ability to make changes quickly that have the least possible impact on you. Make no mistake, however; health care costs are increasing and the Trust cannot absorb 100% of the increases as long as CCSD is not willing to increase the amount it funds for your benefits.

Inside this edition is some information about submitting documentation in a timely manner. I cannot stress too much the importance of this information. With about 36,000 people enrolled in a Health Trust plan, it is important that we have the most current information. Address and marital status changes, dependent information and email addresses are vital to enable the eligibility department to be able to keep track of you and to ensure that the appropriate people are receiving benefits. We can't contact you if we do not know how to find you and this could be costly to you in certain instances. In addition, during the course of some routine eligibility audits, we have found that there are some dependents on the plan that have received benefits but are not eligible for coverage. This is costly to the plan and reduces the funds available for those of you who are entitled to the benefits that the Health Trust has to offer. It takes a few minutes to update your information – please do so when necessary.

All of us at the Health Trust look forward to serving you to the best of our ability during the upcoming school year. Thank you for your support and don't forget the Health Festival on October 20.

Open Enrollment for active employees will begin October 15, 2012. All changes will become effective January 1, 2013. 



OUICK CORRECTION

Forty may be the new 30, but your eyes may not have received the memo yet. The fact is, we might feel younger than our years, but some body parts still wear out, right on schedule.

The lens of the eye is one of those parts. We're living longer, but our eyes aren't keeping up. Surgery to remove cataracts, which routinely form in older eves, is the most common surgery in the United States.

And, according to cataract-specialist Alice Sterling, OD, it's the safest and most effective surgery too. She gives the low-down on the condition:

"The lens works like a magnifying glass inside your eye," she says. "As the magnifier ages and changes, you can start to develop yellowish or opaque spots on it that will cause your eyesight to deteriorate significantly, with cloudiness and blurring the most common result."

Cataracts are pretty much unavoidable. About half of adults between 65 and 75 develop them, and after 75, that number goes way up.

But don't let your eyes make you feel old. Cataracts can grow for several years without any signs, and glasses can often postpone surgery. Once surgery is needed, no need to worry.

The procedure is outpatient, painless and comes with a quick recovery - with normal activities resuming in just a few days. The surgeon just replaces the clouded lens with a fresh, clear implant - it typically takes less than a half-hour.

It's a cliché to say "sight is precious" but that's exactly how we feel. Sight can also be the sense on which your very livelihood hinges. That was the case for one of Dr. Sterling's patients, a woman who draws for a living.

Imagine drawing for living and, after years of clear vision and a successful career, suddenly the world looks different. It would be devastating. That's what happened to 72-year-old Dell

The freelance illustrator began noticing she was unable to see the nuances of different shades of color. A trip to her optometrist, Dr. Sterling, confirmed her cataracts had gotten bad enough to warrant surgery.

Her doctor reassured her about the relative simplicity and safety of the procedure.

A few days later, surgeon Dr. Harry Pappas gave Dell her colors back.



"I was wide awake the whole time and felt no pain," Dell remembers. "After a few minutes, I asked Dr. Pappas, 'When are you going to start the operation?' He laughed and then he told me, 'You're all done—it's over.' I was back home in less than two hours."

Within a few hours, Dell's vision had improving dramatically.

"I'm reading books and newspapers again, and I can watch television without wearing my glasses," she says. "But the best part of all is that I can see colors



All active licensed employees are entitled to a free flu shot. You must show a valid Trust Diamond/Platinum ID card, school picture ID and/or pay stub with photo ID at the time of registration in order to qualify.

- Dependents and guests can obtain flu shots for \$25 per guest.
- Discount coupons will be available to all guests preregistered by an active CCSD-licensed employee eligible for a Trust medical plan at designated preregistration sites. (See Preregistration for additional information.)

Glucose & Cholesterol

All active licensed employees are entitled to free glucose and cholesterol screenings with Quest Diagnostics. You must show a valid school picture ID and/or pay stub with photo ID at the time of registration to qualify.

- Dependents and guests can obtain glucose and cholesterol screenings for \$10 per test.
- For more accurate results, fasting for 12 hours prior to the test is recommended.



Health Festival Preregistration

The annual Health Festival is quickly approaching, and to prepare for the largest event in the school district, the Teachers Health Trust in conjunction with the Clark County Education Association has confirmed dates, times and locations for all eligible employees and retirees who wish to preregister for the event.

All CCSD-licensed personnel and retirees are encouraged to preregister themselves, their dependents and guests for the Health Festival. Preregistering for the festival affords you many benefits, including discounted flu vaccinations for your family and early access to all the forms needed to obtain vaccinations and screenings during the festival.

SAVE TIME & MONEY

Preregistration saves you valuable time on the day of the Health Festival for you, your dependents and guests. Preregistration for the Health Festival will allow you to:

- ≤ Enter the festival without waiting in the event day registration line to receive your wristband (required to enter).
- Receive and complete all appropriate forms needed to obtain your flu vaccination, pneumonia vaccination, blood glucose test and/or cholesterol test.
- Utilize a flu vaccination line designed specifically to accommodate and thank you for taking the time to preregister.
- Ensure you have quicker access to vaccinations and screenings.

All CCSD-licensed personnel and retirees eligible to enroll in a Teachers Health Trust or Retiree Health Trust plan are entitled to receive free flu vaccination, but dependents and guests will be charged \$25 apiece. By preregistering, guests and dependents will receive a discount coupon for \$5 off the cost of the flu vaccination.

NOW ONLINE

Preregistration provides numerous benefits, including discounted flu vaccinations for your family and early access to most forms needed to obtain the vaccinations and screenings during the festival. Preregistration also allows you early access to the festival as well as two separate lines for flu vaccinations, screenings and other services.

For your convenience and per your request, you may now preregister for the Teachers Health Trust Annual Health Festival online at www.teachershealthtrust.org. For those of you who would prefer to continue face-to-face preregistration, the Trust has designated three days (October 9, 11 and 16) for your convenience. Additionally, you may stop by the Trust any time during regular business hours from October 8-16, and ask for a Wellness Representative. He/she will assist you with preregistration. You may also register on site the day of the event.

PREREGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS (NO EXCEPTIONS WILL BE MADE).

- You MUST have a valid <u>CCSD picture ID</u> or <u>driver's license</u>; and
- You MUST have a <u>Teachers Health Trust Diamond/Platinum ID card</u>, <u>Retiree Health Trust ID card</u> or <u>recent paycheck stub</u>.
- **You MAY ONLY preregister yourself and dependents/guests.**
- All licensed personnel wishing to register must be present!
- Please note that these requirements apply to participants registering on the day of the event as well.

The Trust knows that teachers and parents alike take great pride in watching our local students excel in their many endeavours. We are happy to announce that, along with the return of the Art Contest, the 2012 Health Festival will also include our first talent show.

We hope that you will take this chance to encourage all of the children of the CCSD to take part in this year's festival by entering one or both of the 2012 contests. We look forward to seeing all the young talent our community has to offer.

Performance Eligibility

- ≤ All Students K-12 attending Clark County Schools are eligible.
- Each school will be responsible for selecting and submitting a maximum of 3 talent individual or group entries (three separate performances) per school.
- One person or one group may represent each school.
- ≤ Application must be submitted by October 4, 2012. Access the application online at www.teachershealthtrust.org.
- The Teachers Health Trust Wellness Division will select 1 entry to represent each school and perform at the 2012 Health Festival.
- Applicants will be notified of acceptance via e-mail and/or phone call.
- Applicant packets will be delivered to your school via school mail at least 1 week prior to the event.
- Contact the Trust Wellness Department if you would like to do a brief rehearsal the Friday prior to the event from 2-5 p.m., space will be limited.

Performance Rules & Guidelines

- Performances must fall into one of six types: Song, Instrumentation, Dance, Comedy, MAgic or Literary (i.e. poetry, stage, etc.).
- Performance groups may consist of 1- 5 members.
- Individual performers and/or groups may not take part in multiple acts. Performers may only partake in a single solo or group act.
- Each act will have 5 minutes to set-up, perform, and teardown.
- ≤ Each act must be available 45 minutes prior to their time of performance for red carpet photos.

GETTING PREPARED
for Flu Season

Flu season is upon us once again, and the Trust is urging all participants to attend the 2012 Health Festival in order to get their vaccination. Influenza is contagious, affects the lungs and can lead to more serious illnesses such as pneumonia. Young children, older people, pregnant women and those with certain chronic conditions such as diabetes, asthma and/or heart disease should be sure to be vaccinated annually as they are at increased risk of serious flu-related complications. That being said, even younger, healthy people are at risk of illness that may result in missed work, school or hospitalization.

The Center for Disease Control recommends that everyone six months of age and older receive a flu vaccination as the primary protection from the virus. Getting the flu vaccine early each flu season is optimal since the vaccine will last throughout the flu season. While there are numerous different and variant strains of flu viruses; each year, the vaccine produced is created to protect against the three predominant strains of the current flu season

Yes, flu viruses can change from one season to the next or even within the course of one season. This may sometimes result in a less than optimal match between the viruses within the vaccine and those currently circulating. Nonetheless, even when the vaccine is not an optimal match, receiving the flu vaccine is the best protection from influenza since antibodies made to respond to one strain can provide protection against other related strains. For these reasons, even during seasons when there is a less than ideal match, CDC continues to recommend flu vaccination, especially for those at high risk.

One of the primary goals of the annual Health Festival is to ensure that our participants and their dependents have a date and location

where they can all easily receive their annual flu vaccination. We highly urge you to join us on October 20, 2012 at Cox Pavilion to ensure you're prepared for flu season.

Breast cancer prevention starts with healthy habits — such as limiting the amount of alcohol you drink and staying physically active. Understand what you can do to prevent breast cancer.

If you're concerned about breast cancer. you may be wondering if there are steps you can take toward breast cancer prevention. Understand the lifestyle factors that may affect your risk of breast cancer and what you can do to stay healthy.

What can I do to reduce my risk of breast cancer?

Breast cancer prevention begins with various factors you can control. For ex-

- Limit alcohol. The more alcohol you drink, the greater your risk of developing breast cancer. If you choose to drink alcohol — including beer, wine or liquor — limit yourself to no more than one drink a day.
- Control your weight. Being overweight or obese increases the risk of breast cancer. This is especially true if obesity occurs later in life, particularly after menopause.
- · Get plenty of physical activity. Being physically active can help you maintain a healthy weight, which, in turn, helps prevent breast cancer. For most healthy adults, the Department of Health and Human Services recommends at least 150 minutes a week of moderate aerobic activity (think brisk walking or swimming) or 75 minutes of vigorous aerobic activity (such as running), in addition to strength training exercises at least twice a week. If you're just starting a physical activity program, start slowly and build intensity gradually.
- Breast-feed. Breast-feeding may also play a role in breast cancer preven-

greater the protective effect.

Discontinue hormone therapy. Long-term combination hormone therapy increases the risk of breast cancer. If you're taking hormone therapy for menopausal symptoms, ask your doctor about other options. You may be able to manage your symptoms

non-hormonal therapies, such as physical activity. If you decide that the benefits of shortterm hormone therapy outweigh the risks. consider using the lowest dose that's effective for your symptoms, and plan to use it only temporarily.



Avoid exposure to environmental pollution. While further studies are needed, some research suggests a link between breast cancer and exposure to the polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons found in vehicle exhaust and air pollution.

Can a healthy diet prevent breast cancer?

Research shows that eating a diet rich in fruits and vegetables doesn't offer direct protection from breast cancer. In addition, a recent study of dietary fat and breast cancer showed only a slight decrease in the risk of invasive breast cancer for women who ate a lowfat diet. However, eating a healthy diet may decrease your risk of other diseases, such as diabetes, cardiovascular disease and stroke. A healthy diet can also help you maintain a healthy weight — a key factor in breast cancer prevention

Is there a link between birth control pills and breast cancer?

Current evidence suggests that use of oral contraceptives doesn't increase the risk of breast cancer. While older research showed a slight increase in risk, those studies included pills with higher estrogen doses than what's available today. In addition, the older research

> showed that 10 or more years after stopping oral contraceptives, the risk of breast cancer returned to the same level as that of women who never used oral contraceptives.

What else can I do?

Be vigilant about breast cancer detection. If you notice any changes in your breasts, such as a new lump or skin changes, consult your doctor for an evaluation. Also, ask your doctor when to begin mammograms and other

screening procedures to detect breast

Remember, it's not always possible to prevent breast cancer. By practicing healthy habits, however, you're taking an active role in breast cancer preven-

The campaign is open to all Diamond and Platinum Medical Plan participants and is designed to encourage taking an active role with respect to breast health by obtaining free breast exams and mammograms during the months of September, October and November. You do not need to have a referral during the designated times on the other side of this flyer. To receive your free exam, follow the simple steps below:

Step One: Call to Schedule Your Appointment

Contact one of the sites listed on the other side of this flyer to schedule your appointment for a breast exam and mammogram at no charge to you. A physician will be available to provide you with a referral on-site. You do not need a referral before this appointment.

Participants who are aged 40 and older or who have a known family history of breast cancer should obtain an annual mammogram and breast exam. Those who are 20 to 39 years of age should have a physician examine their breasts every three years and should conduct self-exams regularly. Regardless of age, all participants should check their breasts for changes in appearance and sensitivity monthly, preferably seven to 10 days after menstruation. Participants who no longer menstruate should check their breasts the first day of each month.

Step Two: Review Your Test Results

The results of your mammogram will be forwarded to your regular physician. If your results are normal, a notice will be sent to you regarding the test results within two to three weeks from the time your test was performed. If your results are abnormal, you will be contacted by phone and asked to follow up with your regular physician.

In severe and untreated cases, the disease can cause debilitating pain and may also lead to life-threatening complications.

It would be both understandable and justified for any individual suffering from Crohn's Disease to write off the possibility of competing in programs such as WellFit. That being said, one only needs to spend a few minutes with Cassaundra to recognize that there is far too much fighting spirit within her to ever accept the idea that Crohn's would dictate what she can and will accomplish.

Fortunately, Ms. Giffords has plenty of support to accompany her own spirit. She is quick to point out how great a role her friend played in her success as well as all the support she received from her children and colleagues. While Cassaundra prefers to lead a more private life, she also openly acknowledges that the encouragement she received from those who knew of her participation was a key component in keeping her focused and motivated throughout the program.

In the end, Cassaundra points out to me that Crohn's Disease is not what defines life but merely another challenge set before her. Astonishingly, though, she believes it is a part of what has made her strive to be a competitive leader and make personal responsibility part of her life culture. Few of us could express it better. Of course, that is exactly why Ms. Giffords is our 2012 Lifetime Achievement Award winner.

YOU MUST FILE A REPORT ON ALL **INJURIES AND/OR ILLNESSES INCURRED** AT WORK WITHIN SEVEN DAYS!

Claims resulting from work-related injuries must be filed through your Workers' Compensation carrier, not the Teachers Health Trust. This includes, but is not limited to. coaching injuries, environmental illnesses, etc.

If you are injured on the job, the **Clark County School District** (CCSD) and the State of Nevada require that you submit a written **Notice of Injury or Occupational** Disease (Form C-1) within seven (7) days of the incident.

If a timely-filed claim and all permissible appeals (including court reviews) are denied as not being work-related, the Trust will review your claims for payment. The Trust will not consider claims if Workers Compensation denied them because you failed to file your claims in a timely manner.

Regardless of the severity or type, any injury or illness sustained on the job should be submitted to Workers' Compensation. Notify your administrator immediately and then call the School District's Risk Management office at 702-799-2967.
